## Step 1.

Go to this website “ [www.abuseat.org/lookup.cgi](http://www.abuseat.org/lookup.cgi) “ and the input the needed IP Address for checking.


## Step 2.

Scroll down to the bottom of the page and look for “ Self Removal “ Section then click the “**remove**” button

- CBL allows end-users/clients for self removal but you need to make sure that you did an action to prevent the blacklist issue on your side.

### SELF REMOVAL:

Normally, you can remove the CBL listing yourself. If no removal link is given below, follow the instructions, and come back and do the lookup again, and the removal link will appear.
